the Torah	ners 1 – Taking Out the Torah: Opening and closing the Ark when we take out of the Ark at the beginning of the Torah service. At this time, parents and ents of the BM will also be on the bimah.
_	ners 2 – Returning the Torah: Opening and closing the Ark when we return to the Ark at the end of our Torah service.
-	ners 3 – Prayer for Israel: Opening and closing the Ark for the Prayer for his is a great time for a larger group. Consider honoring your B'nai Jehudah es).

Torah Undressers/Dressers: During the Shabbat morning service, the Torah scroll is undressed before the BM reads their portion and then dressed again afterwards. The Torah is dressed in cloth and silver ritual items. Kids are welcome to participate in this honor.

The **undressers** come to the bimah during the *hakafah* (walking with the scroll around the room), the rabbi does not call them by name. The **dressers** come up after the Torah reading when the rabbi calls them up by name, along with the person doing *hagbahah* (lifting the scroll).

	Dressing the Torah:
sc ould r ra	whah (Lifting the Torah): After our BM reads from the Torah, it is traditional to lift roll so that all might see the words of Torah that have been read. This person if feel comfortable lifting approximately 20 pounds; it primarily requires balance. In bbis will help the person practice before the service. This person should be a nadult over the age of 13.
	Lifting the Torah (1 person):
